n today's Gospel story, Jesus tells of a father and his Ltwo sons, one of which He refers to as a "prodigal", meaning a person who spends his or her money wastefully and excessively. This certain son did not want to wait until his father died to get a portion of his father's estate (or inheritance), but wanted it immediately. In Jesus' time, this was an insult, and pushing forth in this manner was not only disrespectful toward his own father, but against the tradition of his older brother receiving the inheritance first (which would have been double since he was firstborn). The Bible tells us that his father agreed to the request and 'divided unto them his living.' Not many days after, this younger son gathered his belongings and left for a far country where he, very quickly, spent all his money and soon was left with nothing, becoming poor beyond measure. He was starving and had no home, and because he needed to eat, he took a job feeding the pigs, which for the Jewish people was very embarrassing and demeaning.

But this son soon realized that his father's servants back at home were probably living better than he was, and that he was wrong to do what he did. So, he decided to return home and beg for his father's forgiveness. And do you know what happened? His father was so happy to see him come back that he threw a big party for him because, despite his actions, his father never stopped loving him or looking forward to his return.

This is God's end desire for all, including the lost. He wants to welcome them home and put on them the identifying markers that they are His Child and they are restored. Those that are spiritually dead He wants to make alive once more. In your life, now or in the future, if you ever find yourself in a prodigal state of living, without hesitation, turn back to our heavenly Father and let Him restore you. Experience His compassion of salvation offered through our Lord Jesus Christ.
