🔯 St. Philip's Fast: Awaiting the Saviour, Jesus Christ

n November 15, forty days before Christmas, our Church begins to prepare for the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord. In our Byzantine Rite it is referred to as St. Philip's Fast, because it starts the day after St. Philip's Day. During these forty days, we prepare to celebrate the coming (therefore Advent which means coming or arrival) of God's Son, Jesus Christ, into this world.

Many faithful people had waited a long time for the coming of Jesus. During this long period of time, God spoke to prophets and instructed them how He wanted His people to prepare for the coming of His Son. He told them that they needed to repent, Change their way of living, make peace with one another, care for each other, and be obedient and faithful to God. Similarly, every year during this forty-day period we are invited to prepare in like manner as we await Christ's arrival.

Forty days can seem like a very long time for children -- and even adults. We know how anxious we are when a birthday or anniversary is approaching - how we want to start planning a party and inviting our friends. When we think about that special celebration, we realize that part of the enjoyment of it is the time we spent getting ready for it.

The Church helps us get ready for this very special celebration of Christ's birth. First, the Church issues an announcement, much like an invitation, letting us know that the Feast of the Nativity is approaching. Then, during this forty-day period there are additional announcements made on special days which instruct us on how to get ready and focus our attention as the feast approaches. Those special days are: November 21 - when Mary the Mother of Jesus first entered the Temple; November 30 - the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, the First-Called; December 6 - the feast of St. Nicholas the Wonder-worker; and the Two Sundays before Christmas, which tell us how people of the Old Testament prepared for the Coming of the Saviour.

St. Philip's Fast (like Great Lent) is a special time in our lives that we can use to prepare for this very important Celebration. Through prayer, fasting, and good works, we will meet the baby Jesus worthily and joyfully. And let us always remember that through sincere spiritual preparation for Christmas during St. Philip's Fast, our heart will become a manger for Jesus Christ where He can be born and rest.
