

6 esus is the continual source of life and sustenance. When we're getting thirsty, when we're running low, we draw from the well so we can be replenished. The wellspring of life is a continual flow of blessing. It's like when Elijah blessed the widow with the continuous supply of oil to meet her needs. With Jesus, we have a continual source of living water available to us. The well will never dry up; the spring will never cease to flow. But we have to bring our jars and fill them up. If you're not getting filled it's because you're not going to the well. And trying to run on empty just doesn't work. We can prevent this by not allowing ourselves to get too low before we fill up again. 

Why does the Eastern Church commemorate the Samaritan Woman today?

Because this is the first Sunday after Mid-Pentecost, the feast that stands half-way between Easter and Pentecost. At Easter, the great truths of the Church are revealed: Christ is both God and man, and He was crucified and risen from the dead. However, these truths, may remain rather abstract until at Pentecost we understand their inner meaning, their implications for our daily life. By the Coming of the Holy Spirit, these truths become living, and we worship Christ in spirit and in truth. Thus, the Church reads to us the words that, 'the hour is coming when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth'.

Let us this day pray that we too, like the Samaritan Woman, may bring others to the Church, testifying like Her to the Divinity of Christ, becoming reapers of that which we have not sown. Христос воскрес! Boiстину воскрес! Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

Jesus Is The Living Water



hen visiting a friend, your friend asks if you would like something to drink. 'Yes, I would," you answer. "What would you like?" your friend replies. "What do you have?" you ask, and your friends answers, "I have pop, fruit juice, and water."

Which drink would you choose? Your answer probably depends on whether you are actually thirsty or just want something to drink. The number one choice that children make is pop. Now, pop taste pretty good, but if you want something that will satisfy your thirst and provide what your body needs, a pop wouldn't be the right choice. Pops are high in sugar and have a lot of Calories that we don't need. You might think that fruit juice would be a good choice, but surprisingly, they often contain as much sugar and Calories as pop. If you want a healthy choice, it is clearly water!

In our Gospel story today, Jesus teaches us the most important lesson about drinking water that we will ever learn. One day Jesus was walking through a town in Samaria. He was hot and tired so He sat down beside a well to rest. A woman came to the well to get some water and Jesus asked her if she would give Him a drink. The woman was surprised that Jesus

spoke to her because Jews would not usually speak to Samaritans. She said to Him, "Why do you ask me for a drink since You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan?" Jesus answered and said, "If you knew who was asking you for a drink, you would ask Him for a drink and He would give you living water."

"You don't even have anything to get water in, how can You give me living water?" the woman asked. Then Jesus explained, "Whoever drinks from the water from this well will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst again."

Jesus wasn't talking about the thirst for water from a well, he was talking about a thirst for God. The Bible teaches us that we have a thirst in our heart for the living God and that is a thirst that only Jesus can satisfy. So, when we have Jesus in our heart, he totally satisfies our thirst for God and we will never thirst again!

Dear Father, we thank You for sending Jesus, the Living Water. We pray that everyone will drink of that Living Water so that they will never thirst again. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

What should we learn from the woman at the well?

THE STORY OF THE WOMAN AT THE WELL teaches us that God loves us in spite of our bankrupt lives. God values us enough to actively seek us, to welcome us to intimacy, and to rejoice in our worship. As a result of Jesus' conversation, only a person like the Samaritan woman, an outcast from her own people, could understand what this means. To be wanted, to be cared for when no one, not even herself, could see anything of value in her—this is grace indeed.

But there are many other valuable truths we glean from this story. We learn that:

- 1) Only through Jesus can we obtain and receive eternal life: "Jesus answered, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:13–14; cf. John 14:6).
- 2) Jesus' ministering to those outcasts of the Jewish society (the Samaritans) reveals that all people are valuable to God and that Jesus desires that we demonstrate love to everyone . . . including even our enemies (John 4:7–9; Matthew 5:44).
- 3) Jesus is the Messiah (John 4:25–26; 1:41; Matthew 27:22; Luke 2:11).
- 4) Those who worship God, worship Him in spirit and truth (John 4:23–24; Psalm 145:18).
- 5) Our testimony about Jesus is a powerful tool in leading others to believe in Him: "Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in Him because of the woman's testimony, 'He told me everything I ever did.' So, when the Samaritans came to Him, they urged Him to stay with them, and He stayed two days. And because of His words many more became believers. They said to the woman, 'We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this Man really is the Saviour of the world" (John 4:39–42).

Additionally, we learn from Jesus' dialogue with the woman at the well three absolute truths about salvation:

- 1) Salvation comes only to those who recognize their desperate need for the spiritual life they do not have. Living water can be obtained only by those who recognize that they are spiritually thirsty.
- 2) Salvation comes only to those who confess and repent of their sin and desire forgiveness. Before this immoral woman could embrace the Saviour, she had to concede the full burden of her sins.
- 3) Salvation comes only to those who take hold of Jesus as their Messiah. For the absolute truth is that salvation is found in no one else (John 14:6; Acts 4:12).
