In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus is proclaiming what He expects of His followers – they must be prepared to lose their lives while following Him. He goes on to make it even clearer, "For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for Me and for the gospel will save it." However, Jesus is not necessarily referring to physical life here, although that may be included, but mainly He is referring to the inner life – to the soul. Jesus is saying that we cannot

choose to follow Him and continue to pursue our own life with all its wants and desires. The phrases 'I want ...', 'I'm going to ...', 'I will ...' and perhaps even 'I need ...' are simply no longer part of our vocabulary, or even the thought process. It is now and always 'Jesus wants ...', 'Jesus is going to ...' and 'Jesus will ...'.

Jesus' teaching would have been very hard for those who initially heard it, but we know that the Holy Spirit was given to make that close connection to God, so that we can always hear His voice.

### **How to Find Time in the Day for Lent**

Our busy lives may seem to leave little time and energy for the traditional Lenten practices. But we can weave moments of spiritual awareness and service into the busiest of schedules.

**Praying Daily** ~ If you make a habit of saying a little prayer whenever someone irritates you, cuts you off in traffic, or makes life difficult; when someone does you a favour, you experience great and friendly service, or when something joyful happens to you—you will soon find yourself praying your way through the day.

A Different Type of Fasting ~ Why not fast from criticism, gossip, judging others, or passing on rumors? Why not abstain from unwarranted fear and anxiety? These are beautiful ways to observe the Lenten call to fasting and abstinence.

Give of Yourself ~ Give encouragement to the doubting, give a word of praise to the insecure, show kindness to someone who could use a friend, and offer a word of thanks to those whose service of others often goes unappreciated. Give the gift of your attention to someone who simply wants to be noticed. Don't be stingy with your smiles—give them freely to everyone you meet. And most important, give your love to those close to you. Hug them, hold them, and tell them what they mean to you. In this way you open your heart to God and others.



# Jesus Calls for Total Commitment in Following Him

nvision this. You are about to take a long-awaited vacation to a sunny island resort and must fly to get there. As you walk down the airline's boarding ramp and enter the airplane, you search to find your seat and sit down. While settling into your seat and looking for your seatbelt, you hear a friendly voice come over the plane's intercom. "Good morning, passengers. We'd like to thank you for choosing Apathetic Airlines. Please note that today's flight from Thunder Bay to Orlando is being flown by a pilot who is not fully committed to flying... it's just a paycheck for him. In fact, he hasn't yet arrived at the airport, but we're expecting him to at any moment now. In the meantime, please relax and enjoy your wait."

Or, how about this scenario? You have an aching lower molar, and suspect that you might need a "root Canal" performed. You make an appointment with an unfamiliar dentist to whom you were referred by a co-worker. Hours later, you anxiously find yourself reclined in the dentist's Chair wearing a paper bib and Chain, and staring up into a bright lamp. Your heart rate quickens as you hear the dentist enter the exam room, and you hope that she is as good as your co-worker has said she is. "Will this hurt?" you ask. "How should

I know?" the dentist replies. "Yours will be my first single-handed root canal since my clinical practices back in dental school. Besides, I didn't really choose this profession anyway! My deceased grandfather was a dentist and my mother thought my becoming one would be a noble way to honour his memory... Now, just relax, and let's hope that you won't feel anything after I stick you a couple of times with this long needle."

While these two situations are laughable in general, we know that it is very possible to find ourselves at the mercy of someone who-for whatever reason-is not totally dedicated to his/her profession. When Jesus calls us, however, He sets the pace and then calls us to walk into the unknown (unknown to us, anyway) with Him in total commitment. True discipleship means that we first acknowledge Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. Then we follow in His footsteps, remaining faithful to Him all the days of our lives. Jesus said that He wishes or desires that no one should spend eternity away from Him (2 Peter 3:9). The question for all of us then is: Where will we spend eternity... with or without God?
