# Comforting Words of Reassurance

Good friends bring us closer to Jesus. Best friends break through any obstacle, any crowd, and any roof to drop us right at His feet.

### Question: What does the Bible say about friends?

**Answer:** Human beings were created to be social creatures, meaning that we are most comfortable when we have family, friends and acquaintances. Friendship is an important element in a fulfilled, contented life, and those who have close friends, whether one or two or a multitude, will usually be happy and well-adjusted. At the same time, those who call themselves our friends may cause us grief and hardship, constantly disappointing us.

Proverbs 1:10-19 and 4:14-19 contain warnings about friends and how we should choose them. We are not to associate with those who entice us to do wrong, no matter how appealing their "friendship" seems to be. Those whose "feet rush to sin" should be avoided. The path they choose is no place for a Christian whose choice should be to follow the "path of the righteous." Only that path leads to friendship with God, which is the ultimate goal of a Christian.

# The Season of Lent: Planting Seeds of Love

Te are now in an important season in our church year the season of Great Lent. Do you remember how long Lent lasts? That's right, Lent is the 40 days before Palm Sunday which leads right in to Holy Week and Easter Sunday. The word "Lent" comes from another word "Lente" which means springtime. That makes sense...since Lent and Easter always happen during the springtime.

Many of the things we like to do in the springtime are similar to the kinds of things you and I can and should do during Lent as we prepare for Easter. In the springtime, we like to OPEN UP. We put these screens in our windows so we can let the fresh spring air fill our homes. For Lent, a great thing to do is OPEN UP our Bibles and read them more. When we read our Bibles, God speaks a fresh word to us and fills our hearts with His presence.

In the springtime, many people like to CLEAR OUT - especially the clutter in their closets. People go through their Closets and take out the things they don't really need: heavy coats, old shoes- things that will just be in the way. For Lent, it is good to CLEAR OUT the things in our lives that we don't really need — things that get in the way of following Jesus. For example, maybe you watch TV or play video

games a lot. Why not put them away for a while and use that extra time to pray.

In the springtime, we always need to SWEEP UP all the dirt in our homes that has been hiding all winter - like under rugs, dirt that no one else sees, but dirt that we know is there. For Lent, it is good to ask ourselves, "Have I made any mistakes or messes that I need to clean up? Do I need to apologize to someone for something I said or did? Do I need to ask God to forgive me?

In the springtime, many people love to PLANT. They plant seeds in garden pots and water them as they wait and watch them grow into something beautiful. For Lent, it is good for us to PLANT - different kind of seeds. We can plant seeds of love in the hearts of others when we are kind, or helpful, or when we tell someone about Jesus. For Lent, think of something you can do that will become something beautiful for someone else, and do it in the name of Jesus, the one who did something really beautiful for you.

Dear Jesus, we love You. Help us to open up our Bibles, Clear out our Clutter, sweep up our messes, and plant seeds of love during the season of Lent. Amen.
