Jesus comes to the demoniac man seeing and knowing a truth about him that the man can neither see nor know for himself. In the face of that truth the unclean spirit cannot remain. Legion can never be our final reality or ultimate identity. That will always be Jesus. That is the truth that commanded Legion to leave. That is the truth that puts life back together. That is the truth that clothed this man, returned him to himself, and seated him at the feet of Jesus.
