After Christ was baptized, the first words that He said were: 'Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand'. Why? Because after we have been baptized, we are always tempted and the only way to end temptation is to repent. Repentance is not just an idea, a thought, it is, above all, an action. Repentance is a change of mind which leads to a practical and visible change in our way of life.

The Kingdom of Heaven was Christ Himself Who spoke these words to the people of that time, before whom He stood. The Kingdom of Heaven is also here and now, but it depends on our willingness to accept Christ and His Holiness, Mercy and Grace. At this very moment each one of us is, in fact, able to meet God and enter into His eternal joy, but only if we wish to do so through deep repentance. The joy of the Kingdom of Heaven, simply the state of contentment with God, our well-being, is open to all who wish to accept Christ, the Word of God. The presence of the Kingdom of Heaven depends ultimately not on our external circumstances but on ourselves, on our interior disposition, on our ability to repent. Indeed, it is only if we repent that the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. May God grant us the desire for that repentance. "God and sinners reconciled..."


Bless Your Door on the Feast of Theophany

The Gospel tells us that the Magi found Christ "on entering the house." The door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door in chalk the first two numbers of the year (20) + C + M + B + (17) — the last two numbers of the year. Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the Magi or Three Wise Men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Adolph Adam, composer of "O Holy Night", points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedicat" or "May Christ".

bless this dwelling." It is appropriate to bless your door in January as the word "janua" means "door" and the first month is the door to the New Year. After inscribing the doorway, say the following prayer: God of Bethlehem and Cana, God of Jordan's leaping waters, in baptism You bring us into Your family. You wed us and embrace us as Your beloved. May we fill this place with kindness to one another, with hospitality to guests, and with abundant care for every stranger. By the gentle light of a star, guide home all who seek You on paths of faith, hope and love. Then we will join the angels in proclaiming Your praise: Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen. Then sing a short Christmas or Theophany carol.

Still haven't made any **New Year's Resolutions**? Consider the following five:

- 1) Come to church every Saturday/Sunday and pray more, especially the Rosary.
 - 2) Save something for the poor and/or donate more to worthy causes.
 - 3) Learn to listen to your family and friends, and to God.
 - 4) Stop comparing yourself to others God loves you just the way you are.
- 5) Be more like Jesus ~ honest, open, and loving ~ following His examples daily. Focus on building His Church with unconditional compassion and mercy for all.





Jesus Wants to Us to Head in the Right Direction

Today's Gospel story tells us about Jesus after hearing that His cousin John the Baptist had been put in prison went away to Galilee to fulfill what the prophet Isaiah had said: "Galilee, land of the Gentiles! The people who live in darkness will see a great light. On those who live in the dark land of death the light will shine." Jesus is the Light of the World, and He began to preach the message: "Repent from your sins because the Kingdom of heaven is near!"

Now, what does repentance mean? It means 'a Change of direction." It means turning away from what we know to be wrong and turning to God.

Let's look at it another way. Imagine you are looking at an empty glass turned upside down. Let's pretend is it like our lives. Now, imagine a big pitcher of delicious lemonade nearby. Let's pretend it represents the good things God has for us. The glass might think "I'd really like some of that refreshing lemonade." So, you pour out some of the lemonade onto it but notice that something's not right. All the lemonade that represents the good things of God just spilled out and none went into the glass. If we want to be filled with the good things of God we need to be turned to God.

The glass that represents our life needs to be turned to God in order to Catch all that He has for us. Remember: if we are turned away from God doing things we know are wrong, we won't be able to receive all He has for us. Repentance means turning around and turning towards God – to welcome Him and His wonderful life.

In the Bible, God shows His kindness by warning His people of the consequences of sin. Today you and I have God's Word so we can know how to live a life that pleases Him. We have the New Testament because God's promised Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ has come into the world. He was born for our salvation. He walked on this earth teaching people to turn from sin and to live a life that pleases God. He performed miracles that showed God's power. He loved us so much that He didn't want us to have to face the consequences for our sin which is to be separated from God's presence forever and ever.

Have you repented and turned to Jesus so you can be saved? If you are a Christian or a follower of Christ, it's never too late to be rescued from the consequences of your sin.

Christ is born ~ Let us glorify Him!
