n today's Gospel account, Jesus stopped to draw attention to a woman's plight and relief because she needed to realize that she wasn't an interruption or unimportant to Jesus;



she mattered because she reached out in faith. She needed to hear someone call her "Daughter," affirm her faith and send her home in real peace. With His compassionate words, Jesus expanded and deepened her healing.

The world often devalues good things by CALLING them unnecessary interruptions. But Jesus invites us to come to Him like this woman did. He assures us that we'll never be an interruption. He reminds us to trust in Him. The timing of His response might seem odd, but we're not God. His timing is perfect. We can simply rest and live in His perfect compassion. And we can pass along that compassion by treating others as Jesus treats us.

Our next scheduled bingo session is a matinée on Friday, December 20. The next SUPERIOR SHORES training session takes place on Saturday,




December 14 from 11 a.m. to 12 noon. Speak with Gerry Bullock if you are able to volunteer or wish to attend the training.

Faith + Jesus = Hope

o you like math? Even if you really don't, today's Bible story is simple addition: Faith + Jesus = Hope. Let's look at it and see just how.

Jesus and His disciples were on their way to a town Called Capernaum whereupon their arrival a large crowd met them. Included in this crowd were a man called Jairus and a woman with a bleeding disorder. Jairus' only daughter was very ill and about to die. He had heard and greatly believed that Jesus could heal her and spare her life. But on His way to



Jairus' house, the woman with the bleeding disorder for twelve years, managed to come up to Jesus and touch the bor-

der of His clothing — and she was immediately cured! Jesus felt 'power' had gone out from Him, and asked, "Who touched Me?" The woman then realized that He knew, so she came trembling before Him and fell down at His feet and explained to the crowd what she did and how she was healed instantly. Jesus said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace." It was this faith, not the action itself that Jesus addressed, and it is important for us to understand and remember.

Unfortunately, while Jesus was speaking with the woman, a messenger came from Jairus' house telling him that his daughter was dead, and not to bother Jesus anymore. But Jesus heard this and said, "Do not be afraid; only believe, and she will be well." But Jesus continued on to Jairus' house and came upon the girl who had died and said to those who were crying and mourning for her, "Do not cry; she is not dead, but sleeping." They laughed at Him, but He took the girl by the hand and called out, "Get up, my Child!" Her life returned, and she got up at once. Her parents were amazed, but Jesus ordered them not to tell anyone what had happened because He did not want to be known for His miracles, but rather His message of salvation.

Jesus had demonstrated His authority over disease earlier with the woman, and now over death with Jairus' daughter. And, He's able to demonstrate His authority in our lives in any manner that He sees fit. This story also shows us how Jesus intervenes in hopeless situations. He offers us hope and healing, and we are called to trust Him even when things seem impossible. Let us rejoice in knowing this. Alleluia!


