THE FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION: A Taste of Advent during Great Lent



During the Fifth Week of the Great Fast, we celebrate a beautiful feast: the Annunciation of Our Most Holy Lady, the Mother of God and Ever-Virgin Mary. For some, it might feel like we are stepping out of the season a little bit as we turn our attention to the story of God's initiative in sending the angel Gabriel to Mary -- a story that feels more like something related to Advent or Christmas rather than to Lent.

But the Annunciation fits well, not just because this feast falls nine months before we celebrate the birth of Our Lord at Christmas but because, in the midst of Lent, we get to see Mary demonstrate for us the disposition we are all trying to achieve through our own Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

On this day, we see Mary give her "yes" to God's saving plan, and we are reminded of that freedom for love that true Christian discipleship demands. Even after the angel spoke with her, Mary didn't understand the fullness of what God's plan might entail, yet she opened herself — heart, mind, and soul — to God's loving will. May Mary's intercession help us follow her example to-day and always.

Jesus Heals a Boy with an Evil Spirit

oday's Bible story is about Jesus and the time that He and three of His disciples were having an argument with the religious leaders. Jesus asked them, "What are you arguing about?"
