Those who express interest in Christ are either among the curious crowd, whose praise is shallow, superficial, and ultimately false, or they are like the blind man, whose desperation led him to abandon everything to come to Christ for salvation, and who gave evidence of that salvation by following Christ obediently and glorifying Him. Are you a part of the crowd, or are you a follower of Christ like the blind man?


