### Focus On Today's Gospel Reading

oday's Gospel reminds us of how great faith rewards. Faith takes hold of what the grace of God has provided. The Canaanite woman came to Christ because she believed what she had heard about Him. The silence of Christ only increased her faith. She never doubted His love even though she was a Canaanite woman. When Christ told her that healing was the children's bread and not to be given to dogs, she responded with faith. She declared that dogs were allowed to eat the crumbs of bread that fell to the ground and that it was enough to meet her need. God will always respond to faith so that He does not contradict or compromise His Word in any way. God knew the woman's great love for her daughter and the level of her faith. His actions enabled her to rise above discouragement and doubt "that the trial of her faith might be found unto praise and honour and glory". (1 Peter 1: 6-7)

God will never contradict or compromise His Word and makes sure that faith takes hold of the gifts of His grace. These gifts are a certainty since they do not depend on anything we have done but on what Christ has done.

The good news is the Gospel of grace. It is good news because we did not do anything to deserve it. We only need to take hold of the blessings and provisions of God's grace by faith. And It is only by faith that we can fulfil God's purpose to the praise and glory of Almighty God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen!

#### MANY YEARS OF DEEP FAITH

Among the Marian feasts listed in our Liturgical Year, the feast of the Patronage (Protection) of the Most Holy Mother of God deserves special consideration. The belief of the Mother of God as the Protectress of our nation reaches like a golden thread from the times of the Kyivan princes to the present day. The secret of honouring the Mother of God as a Protectress lies, per-

haps, in the fact that we are dealing here not with human but heavenly and more powerful intercession. Every person, family and nation would like to enjoy such an intercession and protection. From the very beginning of the Kyivan State, we have had great and powerful enemies. It is small wonder then that our people sought the assistance and protection of the Mother Holy Mother of God whose intercession is all-powerful. For our people, then, the feast of the Patronage has always been, and still remains, a day of great manifestation of love and gratitude to the Most Holy Mother of God, a day of joyous praise and glorification of her protection and intercession.

In 1912, St. Pope Pius X remarked to our Blessed Bishop Nykyta Budka: "Your nation cannot perish, for it has two guarantees: it loves the Eucharistic Christ and the Most Pure Virgin Mary. With these guarantees your nation will survive."

# When We Sit at the Master's Feet, We Will Be Fed

Do you have a dog? What do you feed your dog? Canned dog food? Dry dog food? Do you ever feed him scraps from the table? Most veterinarians say that you should not feed your dog table scraps. Why? They say that table scraps are not intended for dogs and may not provide what a dog needs. That may be true, but just try to convince your dog of that as he sits by the table watching you enjoy a juicy steak. Maybe the meal was not intended for him, but that doesn't keep him from sitting by the table, begging for a little scrap, hoping that just one small bite might fall on the floor for him. Keep that picture in your mind as you listen to our Bible lesson today.



When Jesus came to earth, He came to preach and teach first to the Jews. That does not mean that He didn't love the other people of the world, but the first priority in His ministry on earth was to bring God's chosen ones to repentance.

When other people saw Jesus healing the sick and lame, they followed Him wherever He went. One day there was a woman from Canaan who came to Jesus and asked Him to heal her daughter. Jesus explained to the woman that His first mission on earth was to preach to the people of Israel. The woman refused to give up. She came closer, knelt down, and begged, "Please help me, Lord!" Jesus replied, "It isn't right to take food away from children and feed it to dogs." The woman answered Jesus and said, "Lord, that's true, but even dogs get the crumbs that fall from their owner's table."

Jesus was so touched by the faith of that woman that He told her that because of her faith, her daughter would be healed. Even though Jesus came first to the Jew, He loved us so much that He shared His love with all of us. So, we are a little bit like the dog -- even though the meal was not prepared especially for us, it doesn't keep us from enjoying it. We gladly sit at our Master's feet and thankfully receive whatever crumbs might fall from the table.

## **Thanksgiving Thoughts**

This month, we pause and observe a day our nation sets aside as a holiday. It is "Thanksgiving Day." Hopefully all Canadians will pause to remember just how grateful they should be for the privileges and blessings afforded us. Unfortunately, for our neighbours to the south, it hasn't always been that way. In 1863, a noble American statesman from Kentucky wrote the following Thanksgiving Proclamation:

"It is the duty of nations as well as of man to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God; to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon; and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations are blessed whose God is the Lord.

We know that by His divine law, nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world. May we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war which now desolates the land may be a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people?

We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven; we have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth and power as no other nation has ever grown.

But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us.

It has seemed to me fit and proper that God should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice, by the whole American people. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November, a day of Thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father Who dwelleth in the heavens. — A. Lincoln, 1863

Let us be thankful every day, and especially this season of the year. When we gather as families on Thanksgiving Day, let us be truly thankful for the benevolence God has lavishly poured out on us.
